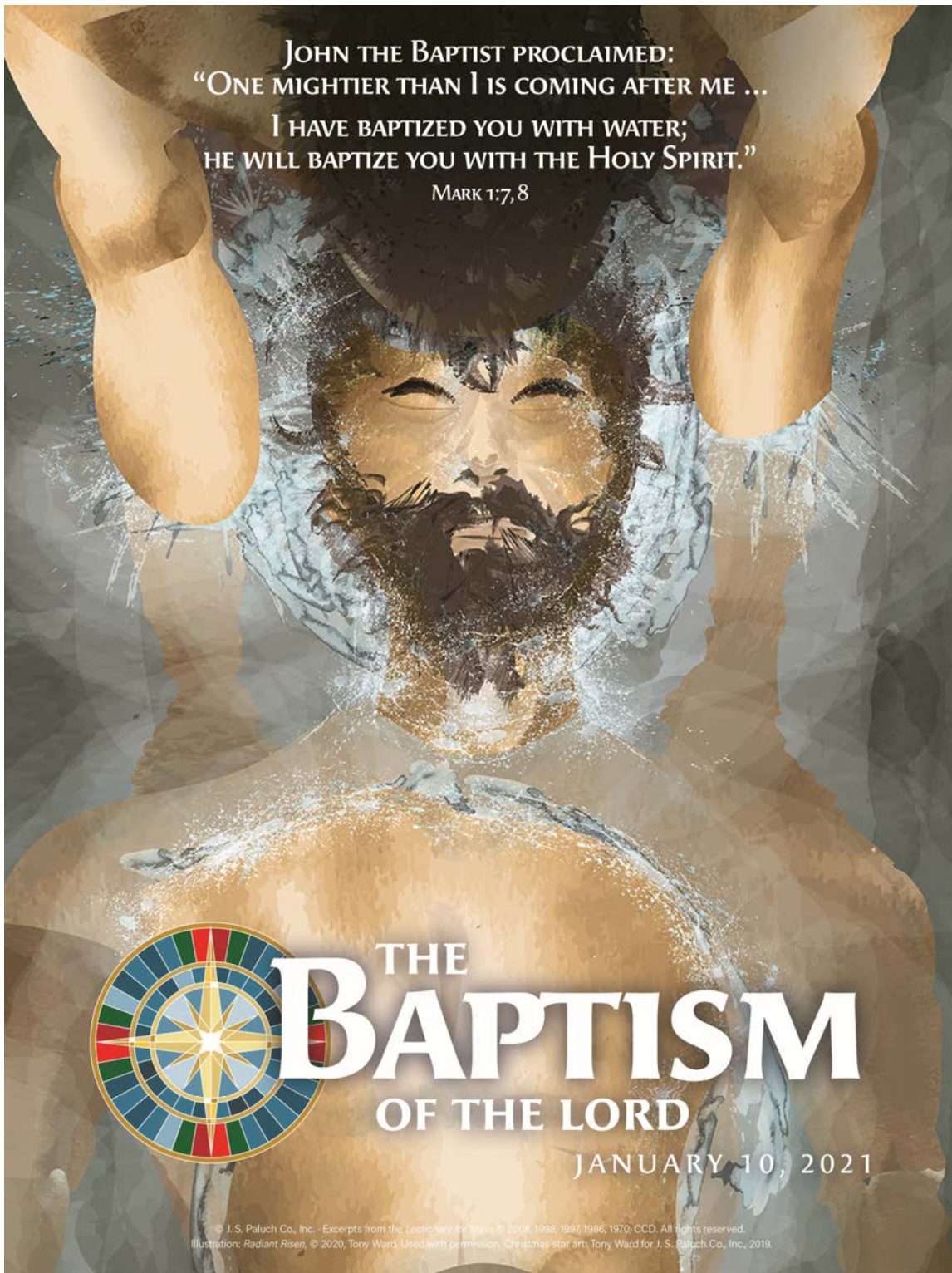

National Human Trafficking Awareness Day is observed every year on January 11. This observance was started in 2011 when President Obama issued a Presidential Proclamation designating each January to be National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month.

Human Trafficking affects people of all walks of life. While many believe that traffickers operate in the airports of foreign countries; the reality is that a trafficker is anyone who assists in the transport, detention, or sale of human beings. Traffickers and Trafficked victims exist throughout the United States and can even be people you know or live amongst. Traffickers often use harsh physical or mental abuse to control and manipulate their victims. Trafficking Victims can be foreign nationals or US citizens that are subjected to the horrific injustices of human trafficking; including sex trafficking, forced labor, involuntary servitude, forced marriage and debt bondage.

**rites of Christian Initiation** Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

**BAPTISM OF INFANTS** Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

**MARRIAGE** Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

**HOLY ORDERS:** Are you thinking of becoming a priest or religious? Talk with Fr. Bob or email Fr. Steven Borello [vocations@dioceseofjoliet.org](mailto:vocations@dioceseofjoliet.org).

**RECONCILIATION** Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or by appointment with Fr. Bob.

**PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK** Please contact the parish office for a visit from a priest when sickness occurs or death is imminent for the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. To arrange for Communion to be brought to the sick/homebound members of the parish community, call Deacon Tom F.

## What Religious Formation Classes are Studying

### Baptism



As part of Christ the Servant's Religious Formation classes, some of our students have been learning about Baptism. Baptism is the Sacrament of regeneration through water and in the word. By

Baptism, the first Sacrament, we are made members of Christ's Church, cleansed of all sin, and receive a portion of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

In this sacrament, the minister of Baptism pours water three times upon the head of the person being baptized (or is immersed three times in water) while saying the words given to us by Jesus, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." This bath cleanses the baptized, removing all sin from his soul, including the stain of Original Sin inherited from Adam and Eve, as well as the temporal punishment for those sins as well as the sins actually committed by the baptized. Sanctifying grace is conferred upon the soul of the baptized, which is the free and undeserved gift of God's very life, and as the children also learned, that sanctifying grace is Mrs. Goba's favorite part of the Sacraments.

They also learned that by Baptism, we are made a new creation, and with the help of the Christian community, the baptized advance on the journey toward salvation. Further, our students learned that Baptism also initiates the baptized into the Church, literally serving as a communal rite of passage that bestows on the person all the rights and privileges — as well as all the responsibilities — that come with being a member of Christ's Church.

## January 11 – February 8, 2021



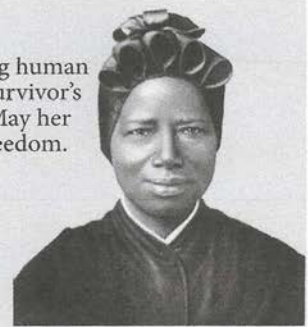

Signs of Trafficking: Kept isolated and activities restricted, May be “coached” to answer questions, Many develop loyalties, positive feelings toward trafficker, Signs of physical abuse, Less appropriately dressed than before, Grooming is less than desirable, Overly tired, withdrawn, depressed and distracted, Displays expensive clothes, accessories or shoes, New tattoos (tattoos of a name, symbol of money) many traffickers use this to brand their victim, Older boyfriend or new friends with a different lifestyle. If you see something suspicious, call the National Hotline at 888-3737-888 or BEFREE Textline 233733
