



Sacramental Information

RITES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

HOLY ORDERS: Are you thinking of becoming a priest or religious? Talk with Fr. Bob or email Fr. Steven Borello vocations@dioceseofjoliet.org.

RECONCILIATION Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or by appointment with Fr. Bob.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK Please contact the parish office for a visit from a priest when sickness occurs or death is imminent for the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. To arrange for Communion to be brought to the sick/homebound members of the parish community, call Deacon Tom Fricke at 630-985-5266.

FUNERALS Arrangements for funerals are usually made in cooperation with the attending funeral home. Contact the parish office for pre-planning of funerals.

Creation Care Corner

Celebrating the Anniversary of Pope Francis' transformational encyclical, Laudato Si'.

"Care for Creation" and *Laudato Si'* (Part I)

- The Pope's encyclical, *Laudato Si'*, is a text of landmark significance in Catholic Social Teaching.
- Francis, like his thirteenth-century namesake, calls the earth our "common home", which is like our sister.
- But we are damaging this familial relationship as we seriously degrade the environment. In so doing, we are damaging our relationship with other humans, particularly those least equipped to adjust to the changing environment: the poor and future generations.
- The Pope encourages people to examine and change their lifestyles through sound ecological virtues, greater simplicity and less focus on material things.
- Francis extends an "urgent challenge to protect our common home ... to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that things can change."
- By taking personal action and reducing excessive consumption and waste in our lives, we can meet our obligation to reduce our impact on the environment while creating a sustainable future for generations to follow.





Dear Sen. Durbin and Sen. Duckworth Dear Rep. _____,

Hunger is reaching historic levels. The Pandemic continues to increase the effects of hunger and poverty here and around the world. I am asking Congress to:

- Reauthorize and strengthen national child nutrition programs, including school meals and WIC.
- Make permanent the 15% increase in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).
- Make permanent the summer EBT program so children get nutrition when school is out of session.
- Make the Child Tax Credit in the American Rescue Plan Permanent.
- Increase U.S. leadership and funding for global nutrition programs.

My faith calls me to stand with the poor and vulnerable here and around the world.

Programs for Ministers of Care
 This program is designed for people preparing to become Ministers of Care of Visitors of the Sick in a parish setting. A Certificate will be given to all who attend four sessions. Permission to be a minister of Care in any parish must be received by a member of the Pastoral Staff.

Cost of \$50/person, registration is required (check made payable to Sister of Mercy). The next sessions are scheduled for September 11 & 18, 2021, from 9 am-1 pm at the Carmelite Spiritual Center, 8419 Bailey Road in Darien. A registration form is available in the parish office, or call 630-969-4141.

Diocesan policy suggests that every three years Ministers of Care receive updating for their ministry. To help parishes fulfill this requirement, this renewal opportunity will give current Ministers of Care the opportunity to take a second look at the skills and Theology of this important ministry. Certificates of renewal will be given at these sessions. Cost for the renewal session is \$20/person, registration is required. The renewal session is scheduled for Saturday, October 2, 2021 from 9-10:30 am.
