LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to

> abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

- Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
- Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulation, serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.)

<u>RITES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION</u> Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

Seniors Can Be Victims of Domestic Violence

Domestic violence affects millions of people, both women and men, of every race, religion, culture, and income level. It's not just physical abuse. Domestic violence can also take the form of yelling, humiliation, stalking, manipulation, coercion, threats, and isolation. A sometimes forgotten population affected by domestic violence is seniors. Every person's experience with domestic violence is different. But, seniors who are in an abusive relationship experience unique challenges when it comes to breaking the cycle and getting help. They are often put at a greater risk of harm. Many older adults will not report domestic violence for a number of reasons. They may be dependent on their abuser for basic needs, such as housing, food, or care. They may be embarrassed or confused about their situation. They may also face isolation and have difficulty leaving the home to seek help. Seniors who experience domestic violence can face greater physical consequences, including a higher risk of falls, greater severity of injury, and slower healing and recovery. While all of these factors paint a dark picture for older adults in domestic violence situations, there is hope. Each of us can do our part to help end elder abuse by understanding how to recognize the signs and assist those in need.

Volunteer Opportunities

Many of the Synod Surveys returned mentioned what a welcoming parish Christ the Servant is. They also mentioned a desire to have more social activities available now that Covid has relaxed somewhat. We want to do that, but it is going to take people willing to help make these events happen. Here are some suggestions:

HOSPITALITY AFTER MASS

We would like to begin having hospitality after mass again. To do this we need:

- Someone to set up (set up tables, arrange donated goods and napkins on tables, etc.)
- Someone to clean up (take garbage out to dumpster, put tables away, freeze leftover foods)
- Someone to donate the snacks people will enjoy, maybe some juice (nothing carbonated) and maybe a bag of ice to chill water.
 Occasional donations of coffee creamer would be nice—we have LOTS of sweeteners on hand.
 At this time we also have LOTS of napkins, plastic cold beverage cups, and LOTS of plastic knives, forks and spoons.
- Someone to make coffee (if needed), pour water into cups. Coffee person would also need to clean up the coffee pots afterwards.

These jobs would apply to each mass. In order to not rely on the same people each time, we will have a **signup sheet in the narthex**. This is probably about 5 people per mass (plus the goodie-bringers) to help make it flow smoothly.

"I'D LIKE TO HELP, BUT I'M SO BUSY!..." If you make it to mass, you can help. To help serve communion, you need to be confirmed (and have a brief training session). To give a family something to do during mass, we have the Host Team ministry greet people as they arrive, offer the music booklet, pass the basket at collection time, take up the gifts or invite someone else to do it, hand out bulletins as people depart. Lectors can read clearly, and do their practice at home—we give you a book with all the readings in it, and the training it requires to know when you do your part. Serving at the altar is another ministry you can do during mass that doesn't take any more time out of your day than attending mass!

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Vacation Bible School is a short-term, yet fulfilling commitment. Helping is open to teens and adults, you will spend five mornings during June 20-24 helping kids enjoy a Monumental adventure! See the VBS description on page 4, and talk with Christine Goba.

OUTSIDE!

As spring slowly makes its presence known, why not adopt a bit of our landscaping if you like working outside? Contact Chris B or Cindy F if you are interested in helping with the Community Vegetable Garden. Or adopt the rose bushes in the berm outside the window wall. Or adopt the landscaping around the Christ the Servant sign on the corner of Havens and 87th. Or...there are lots of places where plants can use a little loving care. We plan to replace a couple of dead trees this spring, and they would appreciate loving care while they become established (especially regular watering.)

Observing the Sabbath encouraged detachment from temporal goods by putting aside time for God. Try designating days this week for a more contemplative state, giving up buying "stuff," and pre-purchasing only the minimum essentials.


