



<u>Sacrament Reminder</u>

Don't forget if your child is planning on making a sacrament that **the Diocese of Joliet requires that children complete a minimum of two consecutive years of religious formation** *before* **receiving sacraments.** Typically, in 2nd grade, our children receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the late fall and the

Sacrament of Eucharist in the spring. (Children must have participated in RF in first and second grade or two other consecutive years of preparation). Preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation, which will be conferred at the end of 8th grade according to the Bishop's schedule begins in 6th and 7th grade. (Full participation in RF in 7th and 8th grade is the minimum enrollment required.)

Faith, Urgency & Action Climate stories have been dominat-

ing the news cycle lately. Record breaking heat waves, droughts, wildfires and related air quality issues are getting progressively worse. Pope Francis reminds us that the scientific consensus is that burning fossil fuels is the primary driver.

God has given us the intelligence to address the problem before irreversible damage is done. Francis, in his World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation tells us we "must listen to science and institute a rapid and equitable transition to end the era of fossil fuels." Let us act individually with a sense of urgency to do what we can to mitigate the problem. Let's also join with larger groups to amplify our power and to influence our representatives, civic and religious leaders to act. -Pope Francis
